BEAUMONT PUBLIC LIBRARY TO HOST MONTHLY NONFICTION BOOK DISCUSSIONS

Beaumont, Texas (June 16, 2010) -- The Beaumont Main Library will host a nonfiction book discussion at 10 a.m. on the first Wednesday of each month.

The first discussion will be Wednesday, July 7 and the first book selection is "Freakonomics" by Steven D. Levitt and Stephen J. Dubner. Levitt and Dubner make economics interesting by demonstrating that "... the tools of economic research can be put to use in the study of the relationships that underlie the events and problems that we encounter and hear about every day," such as cheating, crime, parenting and sports. Readers will take a look at the "inner workings of a crack gang, the truth about real estate agents, the secrets of the Ku Klux Klan," to name a few.

Copies of the book will be available at the circulation desk at the Beaumont Public Library, located at 801 Pearl St., one month prior to the discussion. Discussions are moderated by a library volunteer.

Upcoming selections include: "The Greatest Generation" by Tom Brokaw in August; "Play: How it Shapes the Brain, Opens the Imagination, & Invigorates the Soul" by Stuart Brown in September; and "1776" by David McCullough in October.
